The Gospel today invites us to wrestle with a fundamental, essential, and focal question, "How much do you really want heaven?" The Gospel opens with a **Problematic Pondering**. A man asks Jesus, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Now, his question is a good one, but it is problematic, because he couches it in terms of his own personal power and achievement. For, he wonders what he, himself, must do to attain eternal life. The problem is, none of us have the holiness or the spiritual wealth or power to attain heaven based merely on what we do. The kind of righteousness we need can come only from God. His guestion leads to Jesus engaging in a kind of Preliminary Prescription, wherein he quotes the Commandments and draws out the flawed premise of the man, setting him up for what comes next. And the man takes the bait, for next we see his Perceived Perfection as he announces he has followed the Commandments. For, having heard Jesus quote the second table of the Law, he announces that he has observed all of these from his youth! He must have had a fairly minimalist and perfunctory observance of the law for Jesus observes in the Sermon on the Mount that righteousness involves a fulfilling of the law, not merely a perfunctory observance of it. Thus, it is not enough not to commit adultery, we must banish lust from our minds. It is not enough not to steal, we must act with justice toward the poor, etc. Jesus goes on to discuss the rather Pricey Prescription for the kingdom of heaven. What does heaven cost? The answer is, everything! What does it mean to go to heaven, except to forsake and leave behind everything of this world. Even the apostles, who had left everything to follow Jesus, were astonished by this teaching, and cried out "Then who can be saved?!" And this leads finally in this gospel to the Powerful Possibility proclaimed by the Lord. "For man it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Thus, in the end, salvation must be God's work. He alone can take these tortured hearts of ours, so rooted in passing things, and make them willing to forsake all things for the kingdom of heaven.
