The Feast today is that of All Saints. Many of the saints of the Church we know by name and they have a particular day on the calendar associated with them. Many more however are not widely known in the Church but are known by God and have been caught up with him to glory. This is their day, the day of the countless multitude who have made it home to glory by God's grace and by their amen to the gracious call of God. The first reading today from Revelation speaks to us of their Privileged Place: They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. And they sing the great hymn of the heavens "Worthy is the Lamb!" The second reading from First John speak of their Prize of Perfection. That text says they are like unto God and reflect his glory because they see Him as He is. The Gospel today of the Matthean Beatitudes sets forth a Picture to Ponder of what sanctity looks like. The beatitudes are the description of the transformed human person; they describe what happens to us as Jesus begins to live his life in us through the Holy Spirit. At the end of time, there will be Saints and ain'ts. Which do you want to be?
