Notice in this Gospel today several stages that in some ways remind us of a Mass. First, there is Procession. Mary proceeds in haste to be with her cousin Elizabeth. And when they gather, there is Praise! Mary and Elizabeth are having church. Then there is Proclamation: a word that is exchanged. Mary's word of greeting does not merely convey her voice, with Jesus in her womb the presence of God accompanies her voice and Elizabeth is filled with joy. During Sunday service, when the presence of the Lord is in the lector, the deacon and the preacher you know that not only are they speaking, but also God, and you are filled with joy! Amen? Then, comes Perception. Elizabeth understands that Mary is Mother of the Lord and carries in her the Lord Jesus. John also leaps for joy, recognizing Christ. At Mass we too fall to our knees with joy as the priest says, "Behold the Lamb of God and we recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread." So, in today's Gospel, there's just a little Mass going on, just havin' a little Church up in there.
