The Gospel today shows how the Lord prepares his Apostles to be prophets and evangelizers. The focus is on Simon Peter. First, note that he seeks Simon's Help. Jesus uses Simon's boat to preach from. What talents or resources do you have that the Lord can use? Next, note Peter's Hesitation. The Lord invites him to go to deeper waters and lower his nets for a catch. Peter is tired and doubts that such an effort will be successful. Almost with humor in his voice he says, "At your command I will lower the nets." He expects nothing. Too often we doubt God as well. Next, notice the Harvest. So heavy is the net that it is at the point of breaking. But look at what even a little obedience will do. What might happen if we obey God despite being tired or doubtful? Next, note Peter's Humility. He sees that his doubt and lack of faith were sinful and he repents. How have you or I sinfully doubted God's providence? Finally, note Peter's Heeding of the Lord's invitation to come away and be a fisher of men. Peter has learned and is now ready to step out. What about you?
