Today's Gospel speaks of the Lord as a Shepherd. But guess what? That makes us sheep. It is rather humbling to be compared to sheep. Sheep are wayward creatures. They tend to wander off and get lost. They are rather dumb. Ever hear of a trained sheep? Can't be done they're too stupid. Sheep are weak and vulnerable and need protection. But it is also true that sheep are worthwhile animals. They were highly valued in biblical times for their wool, and still are. Another quality about sheep is that they are wary. They will only recognize their master's voice. They will flee from all others. In this sense sheep are smarter that we are since most of us will listen to just about anyone and be easily lead astray by them. "The Lord is my Shepherd," we often say. Experience the humility of being a beloved sheep in the sheepfold of the Lord.


