On today's Feast of the Ascension we acknowledge that the Lord has gone to heaven for us. He has gone there not to abandon us but to prepare a place for us (John 14:2). He has also gone to take his place at the Father's right hand where he can intercede for us (John 14:12, Heb 7:5). Yet, He also goes to send us the Holy Spirit (John 14:25; 16:7). A final purpose of his going is stated in John 12:32, "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me." This is of special note to us who prepare to evangelize more intentionally. The Lord wants to draw all people to himself. But how will he do this? You may have guessed it has something to do with you! The Lord says in Acts 1:8, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." Who do you suppose the "you" refers to here if not you? As the Lord ascended into heaven an angel spoke to the apostles (and to us). "And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven?" (Acts 1:10) And so, while it is good for us to look to heaven each Sunday it is also important to remember that the Lord has an evangelizing work for us to do. Are you ready?
