In the Gospel today Jesus warns us to beware of crossless Christianity. Many in Jesus' time were looking for a Messiah who in effect announced a prosperity Gospel. Their notion of the Messiah was that, when he came, he would overthrow the Roman oppressors, re-establish the Davidic Kingdom, and usher in a period of unprecedented economic prosperity and worldly glory. But Jesus makes it clear that he, though he is Messiah, has not come to do that. He has come to bear a cross and only after suffering this world's hatred and blows would he enter into glory. There are blessings in living the faith, to be sure, but the cross cannot be set aside or avoided. Beware of any preacher or teacher of the faith who hides the cross or downplays it. Christ had to suffer and he proclaims it openly. He goes on further to declare that we are not exempt from the Cross either. One of the demands of discipleship is that we be willing to walk the same path as Christ, to experience this world's hatred and blows, and then ultimately enter glory by God's grace. There is an old song that says, "Must Jesus bear the cross alone and all the world go free? No, there's a cross for everyone, and there's a cross for me." I've come to remind you, "no cross, (then) no crown."
